- We continue to make budget adjustments as needed. The Proposed Budget will be presented to the Governing Board at the June 11, 2019 Governing Board Meeting for approval.
- Submitted the Letter of Intent to the City's Community Development Department relating to the PDP Amendment for the portables. The application and letter will be submitted to the Hearing Examiner for approval. The process normally takes 2-3 months before we receive a final answer.
- We have received approval of our E-Rate funding for Category 2 in which we will receive 60% funding toward the meraki access points purchased in the current year. We are expected to receive \$31,136.40 toward the \$50,035.37 spent. In addition, we expect to receive an estimated \$26,000 toward our telecomm services (local, long distance and internet). The Business Manager will apply for these funds again in the new fiscal year to help offset the cost of the new Server requested by City IT.



Students created the format, planned the event and served as judges. More than 20 students participated.






