Jacquelin Collins, Superintendent

System Update Jacquelin Collins, Superintendent

- Marilyn Rawlings, City Fleet Manager, is researching whether or not to repair or replace bus #1111. The vehicle is in such poor condition that it may be more cost efficient to simply replace the vehicle and start again.
- Both the City and CliftonLarsonAllen (CLA) internal/external audits continue to be processed in preparation for the CAFR report.
- As part of the Senate Bill 7026 "Mental Health Assistance Allocation" requirement, the CSA submitted a "Mental Health Plan" for each school to the District. We are still in the process of interviewing for a dedicated CSA Social Worker to assist with mental health counseling and assessment, home visits, etc.
- A notification letter will soon go public announcing the CSA VPK Program will be discontinued by the 2019-2020 school year.

Business Management

MaryAnne Moniz, Business Manager

- FY-18 was closed with a formal budget amendment approved by the Governing Board on August 14, 2018 in the amount of \$34,569,683.
- Budget FY 2019-2021 was adopted by the Governing Board on August 14, 2018 in the amount of \$32,402,716.
- Enrollment is up by 19 Full-Time Equivalency (FTE) at 3,129 compared to our FY-19 target of 3,110.

Maintenance

- Interviews for Charter School Building Maintenance
 Supervisor and Maintenance Technician are ongoing.
- The AC at OHS may have to be replaced; price quotes and work completion timelines are being researched and vetted by the City.
- The Security Guard House should be operational by the end of September.

- We are planning to ask the Governing Board to accept a contract with USSI for custodial outsourcing during the September 11th meeting.
- All student enrollment files for free and reduced services have been have been loaded into Rediker.

They loved how structured, organized, and prepared the teachers were, that they didn't even have to ask questions at the end.

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We started the process of digging deeper into data with our 3rd, 4th, and 5th grade teachers. We wanted to help them understand that there is more to putting your lowest children in groups and working on this weeks standard. We wanted to begin teaching them how to look at the STAR data and implement data driven instructional groups based on needs, while using STAR Custom. We will be presenting baseline data and explaining percentile rank buckets at our SAC meeting in September.
