#### **SUPERINTENDENT REPORT:**

Mr. Stephenson states that he is excited to discuss the strategic plan today.

Mr. Stephenson states the Rally will take place again this year. There is an organizational meeting tonight (9/27/16) at 5:00 PM at Oasis Elementary School for anyone who would like to attend.

Mr. Stephenson states that Chick-fil-A has allowed us to have 3 days to raise funds. On November 1<sup>st</sup>, 2<sup>nd</sup> and 3<sup>rd</sup> during breakfast, lunch and dinner Chick-fil-A will give 20% back from your food purchase if you mention one of our schools.

Mr. Stephenson states Chick-fil-A will rotate between Christa McAuliffe and the Oasis campus every other Thursday. Staff members are able to preorder lunch from a limited menu and pick up between 11:00 AM and 12:00 PM.

Mr. Stephenson states that he sent the board members a sample lobbying letter. The lobbying letter will go out to the press as well.

Mr. Stephenson states that our system will be able to help out a local animal shelter. They are looking for people to help build boxes to collect monies. CME and OHS have people willing to build these boxes for the shelter.

Mr. Stephenson states the OES Booster-Thon was awesome. They were able to use the field and it played an integral role in the success of Booster-Thon.

Mr. Stephenson states Oasis High School has started an athletic booster program along with a parent/teacher/student organization.

Mr. Stephenson states that he is waiting for an arts booster program. A unified arts booster program will allow all of our programs to have donations given to them directly.

Mr. Stephenson states that he visited classrooms to see hands on learning. Lori McLain's class had students doing mock surgery and stitching. Andy McCarthy's class conducted a Colonial Faire. Another OHS teacher is having class in Oasis Woods, next to the school.

Chris Porter states there have been more people at the foundation meetings.

Chris Porter states they have a banner sponsor who donated \$10,000.00.

Chris Porter states the money that coming back to the rally this year will go through the foundation and be divided between the schools. One hundred percent of the money raised will go back to the schools, teachers and students.

Chris Porter states there will be a meeting tonight, September 27, 2016 from 5:00-7:00 PM.

Chris Porter states Jami DiMaria has agreed to stay on as the rally chairperson.

Chris Porter states the Light House Awards have been scheduled for May 5, 2017 at the Yacht Club.

Chris Porter states that our system will participate in a website for donations called Donors Choose. The foundation will start the program off by giving donations. Teachers design a project on the website and then others can make donations.

#### **Director of Procurement and Food Services**

Danielle Jensen states they are currently at 34% national school lunch enrollment.

Danielle Jensen states they started the verification process for the National School Lunch program on Friday. They take three percent of lunch applications and verify income.

Danielle Jensen states the official administrative review will be the week of February 6, 2017.

Danielle Jensen states she has been busy working on the \$100,000.00 list for the city. She has worked on 7 projects with various vendors. The total came to just under \$100,000.00.

#### **Christa McAuliffe Charter Elementary School**

Jacque Collins states they had over 300 families attend the WATCH D.O.G.S kick-off. WATCH D.O.G.S. is a father figure organization.

Jacque Collins states Melissa Meehan was on ABC. She works with the Gulf Coast Humane Society on Saturdays bringing children with their favorite book to read to the dogs.

Jacque Collins states that one of their 4<sup>th</sup> grade students was featured on the news. She is raising money for buddy benches by selling soaps. She has raised \$627.91 so far. The Naples Soap Company will match her donations dollar for dollar.

Jacque Collins states her staff participated in ALICE training. ALICE training is an active shooter on campus training. The training teaches different ways of countering an active shooter.

Jacque Collins states their Booster-Thon will be held on October 10, 2016.

Jacque Collins states they started working on their School Improvement Plan.

Jacque Collins states they are receiving great results from their new kindergarten reading program *Super Kids*. Next year they will expand the program to first grade and on to second and third grades the year after that.

#### **Oasis Charter Elementary School (OES)**

Donnie Hopper states that he is thankful to be part of this system.

Donnie Hopper states the Booster-Thon is the biggest fundraiser they've had in a number of years. Teachers, support staff and PTO did an amazing job, it is time intensive. The event raised over \$35,000.00.

Donnie Hopper states it was nice to be able to use the back field for the Booster-Thon. It save time and money by not having to bus students to another location.

Donnie Hopper states that he did a couple of *Meet the Parent* nights. Parents received information and were able to ask questions.

Donnie Hopper states that all grade levels have had curriculum nights.

Donnie Hopper states they have had a PTO meeting.

Donnie Hopper states they have had a spaghetti dinner.

Donnie Hopper states their school improvement plan has been written under their school advisory council. Their goals are in place for this year.

Donnie Hopper states that just as CME they have students who are struggling. Just as they have accelerated classes for the higher achieving students they need classes for their struggling students. These classes will start within the next couple of weeks. Reading will be the main focus at first. Those students will all be together in one room with two certified teachers and a paraprofessional

Donnie Hopper states that he attended a reception at Broadway Palm for the *Keep Lee County Beautiful* calendar winners. Our schools were well represented. The elementary school had two winners recognized and their drawings will be in the 2017 calendar.

#### **Oasis Charter Middle School (OMS)**

Keith Graham states that students from the Cape Coral Technology College came and taught laparoscopic surgery techniques, orthopedics, surgical instruments and emergency room duties to the Science, Health, Engineering and Career classes.

Keith Graham states he has met with a dozen or so teachers to discuss cross curriculum planning and coteaching their lessons.

Keith Graham states the girls and boys basketball and cross country athletic seasons have come to a close.

Keith Graham states this Thursday, September 29, 2016, there will be a Schoology parent night.

Keith Graham states the week of October 10, 2016 will be their fall book fair. Parent night will be October 11, 2016.

Keith Graham states they are looking to send two teachers to Branson, MO. to attend the S.T.E.M. conference.

Keith Graham states the student council is going through their student government elective process.

Keith Graham states the student council is hosting a dance (sock hop) in the OMS gym.

Keith Graham states Red Ribbon week is coming up for alcohol awareness.

Keith Graham states that October is cancer awareness month and will be doing some fundraising for that.

Discussion held.

#### **Oasis Charter High School (OHS)**

Shannon Treece states that OHS had a *Schoology* training a couple of weeks ago. It was attended by 10-12 parents. They may need a follow-up session now that grading has begun. The program has been well received.

Shannon Treece thanks those who supported the Legion of Valor. Colonel Epkins and Sargent Smith did a wonderful job planning the ceremony. One student was recognized and all 735 attending students showed full respect and full participation.

Shannon Treece states they are trying to do specific things to support the new teachers on staff. Several teachers have already attended AICE training and a couple more are leaving tonight, September 27, 2016 for AICE training in Orlando. Those teachers who have attended came back feeling more confident in what they are doing.

Shannon Treece states that OHS teacher leaders will be present at the strategic planning meeting and she hopes the board gets to engage with them.

Shannon Treece states that much of what they have focused on in the beginning of this year has been the engagement piece. Getting students engaged in the environment, engaged in the conversations that are happening in class and doing learning.

Shannon Treece states that some of the upper level junior and senior students want to give back to the system by implementing *Reading Buddies* between them and elementary school students.

Shannon Treece states that October 4, 2016 is *Exhibition Night*. Students who have participated in a true project based learning activity will showcase their work.

Shannon Treece states the athletic boosters have begun and have made a lot of progress.

Shannon Treece states that a group of parents have been meeting every other week organizing a PTSO (Parent/Teacher/Student Organization). They are working on getting officers in place and then will determine where the volunteers need to be plugged into the school.

#### SUPERINTENDENT'S PERFORMANCE EVALUATION

The primary purpose of the Superintendent's evaluation is the improvement of performance. The essence of performance evaluation requires the Board and Superintendent to address what the Superintendent is attempting to accomplish, to assess how well the Superintendent is doing, and to define the area and priorities for improvement. #### PROCEDURES:

• Each Governing Board Member should complete an individual Superintendent performance evaluation. In this phase of the evaluation process, each Board Member works independently, without consulting any other Board Member, to rate the performance of the Superintendent. Written comments to any item are encouraged. The form should be completed in whole, then printed and signed by the evaluating Governing Board Member.

The performance of the Superintendent is to be rated against the four performance Standards as defined below:

*Unsatisfactory* performance is merited when performance has not significantly improved following a rating of Needs Improvement, or performance is consistently below the requirements of a standard and is considered inadequate, or both.

A rating of *Needs Improvement* represents performance that is below the requirements of a standard but is not considered to be Unsatisfactory at the time. Improvement is necessary and expected.

*Proficient* performance is understood to be fully satisfactory. For the superintendent, this is the rigorous expected level of performance. It is a demanding, but attainable level of performance.

Exemplary performance represents a level of performance that exceeds the already high standard of Proficient. A rating of Exemplary is reserved for performance on an indicator or standard that is of such a high level that it could serve as a model for other leaders.

Governing Board Members should rate the Superintendent in all standards using one of the four ratings: Exemplary, Proficient, Needs Improvement or Unsatisfactory.
