### 9. Superintendent's Report

9A: Introduced the Oasis High School Fight Song created by Oasis High Students Eric Feichthaler (Lyrist), and Tyler Feichthaler (Music Arranger). They were accompanied by the OHS Show Choir.

9B Staff Comment: Dr. Christina Britton, Principal, Oasis High School gave a presentation that "expressed the excellence of Oasis High School students and staff." [powerpoint presentation]

9C. Review of the FY 2021 Audit Management Response(s) to Finding(s) and the Charter School Authority's Updated Internal Funds Standard Operating Guide Auditor's Recommendations. The final results of this audit will be shared at a later meeting.

FINANCIAL STATEMENT JUNE 30, 2021/CAFR - The CAFR is still in production - working out last minute details. Superintendent doesn't believe CSA is the only organization with a delayed report; this is due to gaps in reporting procedures, and the conversion of reporting codes and to the Tyler Munis sysytem. Chris Kessler will make a presentation by the next GB meeting in February or March.

JOINT LEGISLATIVE AUDITING COMMITTEE (JLAC) AUDIT FY 2019-20 - request for Management Repsonse is due by March 15, 2022. The Findings has to do with FRS Plan changes when an employee's status changes. In the past, FRS changes/updates were not completed in a timely manner which resulted in the audit flags.

**ACCREDITATION RENEWAL /COGNIA REVIEW** - A final Accreditation Renewal Report is due any day from COGNIA. Once the report is delivered it will be distributed to all parties and published on the Authority's website.

SUPERINTENDENT'S PROFESSIONAL DEVELOPMENT - This upcoming Spring, Superintendent Collins will become a COGNIA Review Team Member for two charter schools. This is professional development and training will give her a preview of the updated accreditation standards that will affect the Oasis Charter Schools in 2025.

**CORONA VIRUS/OMICRON VARIANT** - Collins said the charter schools have suffered from a few COVID surges, in particular the first two weeks return from Winter Break. All the charter schools are following the new CDC guidelines for the *Omicron variant*.

# Why replace with new buses?



Each year, the Charter Schools replace older buses that are becoming costly to maintain due to frequent repairs and/or the need for replacement parts. The existing bus fleet has aged considerably. The majority of the school bus fleet was purchased in 2011, which means the bulk of buses need to be replaced at one time.

State law requires school buses to undergo rigorous and detailed safety inspections every 30 school days. Fleet performs a state inspection to determine whether the buses are running efficiently and safely, and also monitor engine condition.




