HEALTH & SAFETY SUMMARY

Possible contributors to decreased cases in Oasis Charter Schools since October 18th:

Lee County positivity rates have dropped to 3.2%; the state of Florida is at 2.5 % (as of 11/17/21). This is the lowest positivity rate since the beginning of COVID-19 surges starting in February 2020.

Lee County is reporting at least 65.3% of people living in the community are fully vaccinated, which puts the area at medium COVID risk.

Youth and child vaccines are now available and local families are taking advantage of the opportunity to get protected.

HEALTH & SAFETY OUTLOOK

- Quarantines are no longer mandated for students. School leadership is encouraging parents to self report student symptoms and follow normal illness protocols, i.e., staying out of classrooms for 24 – hours or until symptom-free.
- The coronavirus variants *delta*, and the latest *omicron*, have reached the U.S. All school-level related CDC recommendations and preventative measures will be followed as necessary with precaution.
- OCS nurse and health aides have noticed an uptick in the number of students who visit the clinic complaining of respiratory-related discomfort.
- Flu season is upon the nation until April 2022. Experts are warning it could be severe and are encouraging flu shots, whenever possible.
